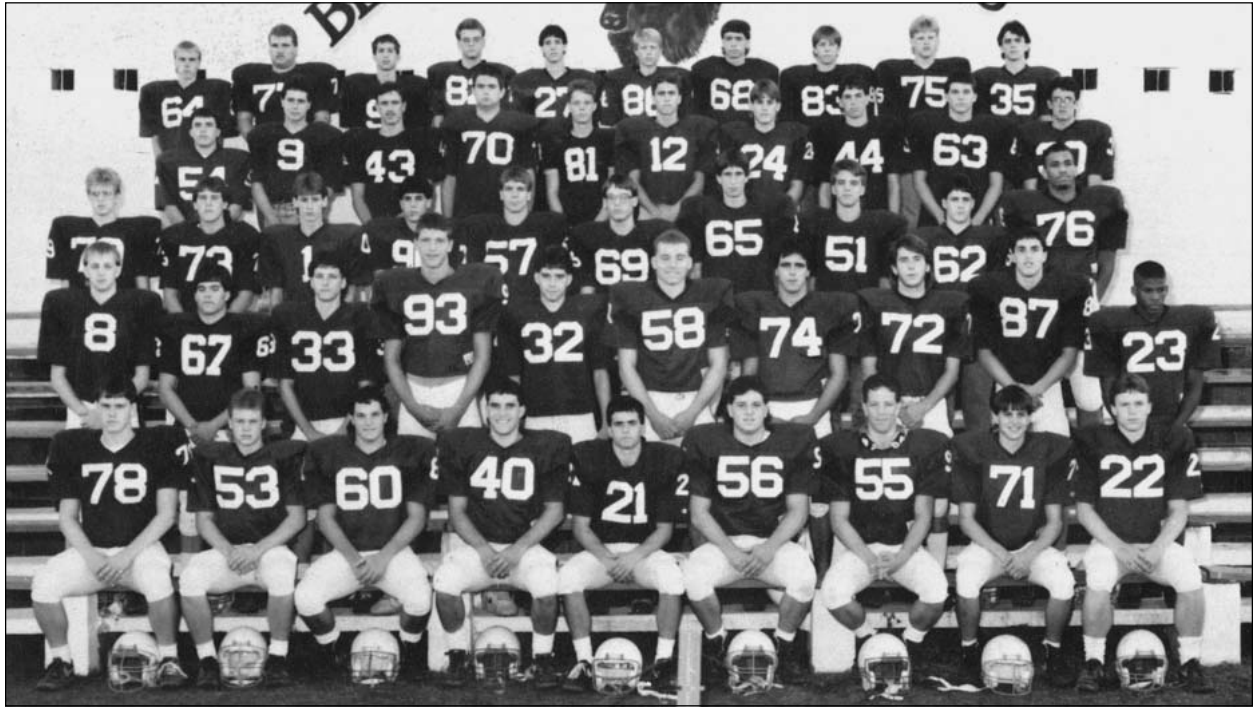

After an 11-1 record in 1988 and returning 5 All Bedford County All Stars including the Johnstown Tribune Player of the Year, Keith Williams, things looked bright for the 1989 team when they took the field at Somerset for their opening game.

Game #1 - Dave Harclerode and Keith Williams scored two touchdowns each and the Bedford defense intercepted five passes as the Bisons came home with a convincing 26-6 win.

Game #4 - Coach Dean McGee got his 200th career coaching victory and 150th win at Bedford as the Bisons beat Central, the school he graduated from. Bedford leading only 14-13 at the half, their defense shutout Central in the second half while scoring twice to win 28-13.

Game #5 - McCort scored first taking a first period lead of 6-0 and had an opportunity to score again when they took over at their own 49. They

moved down to a first and goal inside the Bedford 10. Bedford's defense rose up forced a field goal attempt which was missed. Bedford then marched 80 yards in 11 plays to score. Key plays were passes of Creps to Marshall of 11 and 33 yards and two Williams runs of 11 yards each. Creps scored from the one and Washington ran the extra point putting Bedford up 8-6 at the half. Touchdown runs of 1, 25, and 40 yards by Washington in the second half sealed the victory.

Game #8 - The Bisons defense show up big allowing only 49 yards rushing and 16 yards passing. The Bisons led 18-0 and was about to score again when Tyrone intercepted a pitch on the option and returned it 90 yards for a touchdown. QB Brian Creps got some revenge when on fourth down he ran 42 yards for his second touchdown of the game.

Game #9 - Delighting the homecoming crowd the Bisons scored the first three times they had the ball and built up a 38-0 lead at the end of three quarters. Game #10 - Bellwood had beaten Bedford the last three years; 1986 (34-35), 1987 (20-21), and 1988 (22-28). The loss last year in game 10 cost Bedford an undefeated season. Bedford jumped out to 12-0 at the half on touchdown runs of 47 yards by Williams and 4 yards by Steve Montgomery. In the third quarter Bellwood started at their own 20 and drove 80 yards in 23 plays using 10 minutes for a touchdown making the score 12-6. Coach McGee said that he could envision what happened the last three years happening again. The Bisons were having none of that. Taking a short kickoff to the Bedford 38, they drove 62 yards in 11 plays to score on a one yard run by Williams. Key play in the drive was a third down 31 yard pass, Creps to David Harclerode. The ball bounced off Harclerode's shoulder pad, but he regrabbed it as he was tackled.

In the final football poll Bedford was placed second in the state in Class AA behind State Champion Hickory. Keith Williams finished his career with outstanding career statistics. Keith set a school record for scoring accumulating 327 points including 49 touchdowns. He rushed for 2202 yards which was third best in school history. Keith set the single season record for total yardage with 1918. He was third on the career total yardage behind Rick Cottle and Mike Marshall (1987). Mike Marshall was named 1st team All-State, the first Bison since the great Jack Faust in 1945. Also, Greg Washington was recognized as 3rd team All-State for his outstanding season at running back. This great season marked the end of Coach McGee outstanding coaching career. After 24 years at the helm of the Bisons, Coach McGee would retire posting a terrific record of 157-66-9 as the Head Coach of Bedford. William and Washington were the only 2 backs to run for over 1000 yds on the same team in Bedford history.

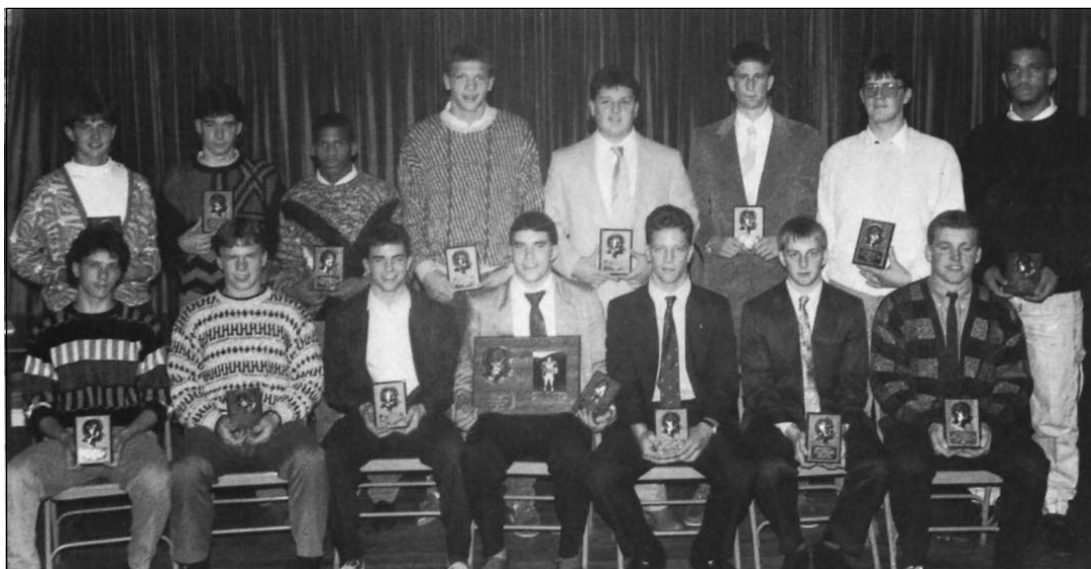

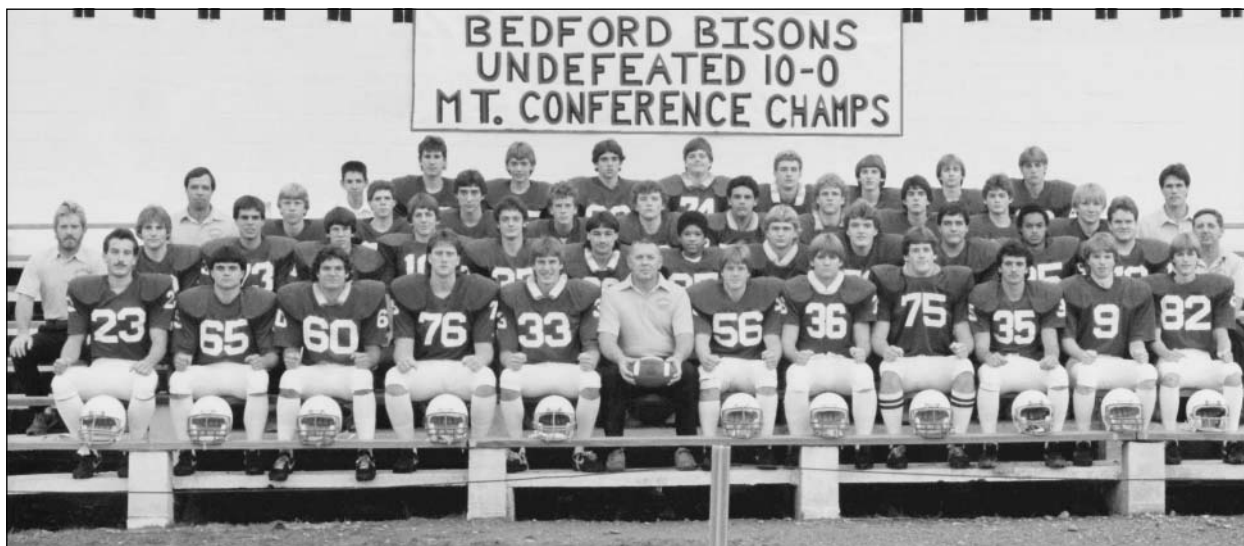
After Bedford beat Everett, Bedford could be one of the four teams in the state playoff. Bedford had a two week wait to see if they would make the playoff. Bedford was third in points behind two WPIAL teams for the playoff spot. Both Steel Valley and Jeannette must loose. Freeport beat Jeannette, but Steel Valley won. Freeport must beat Steel Valley the next week. Steel Valley was trailing 14-13 with 20 second left. Steel Valley scored and Bedford was out.

No team in the history of Bedford High School has done better than the 11-0 record established by the Bisons of 1989, and a two year record of 22-1. They became the 6th team to finish the season undefeated after the 1924, 1929, 1945, 1979, and 1985 teams. Three of the teams were coached by Dean McGee who retired after the 1989 season.

During this undefeated season, the Bisons scored more than 27 points in eight of the wins. In no game did the defense allow more than two touchdowns. District 5 had no district playoffs until the following season. When Coach McGee was asked about his team's lack of opportunity to play in a district playoff, he stated his squad's victories spoke for themselves as Bedford defeated District 6's AA Bishop Guilfoyle and AAA Forest Hill Champions. The squad was also Altoona WTAJ-Channel 10 the #1 ranked team in the Altoona area.

If there would have been a state playoff in 1985 Bedford would have been one of the four teams according to the Harrisburg Patriot.

After seasons of 9-1 (1983) as sophomores, 7-2 (1984) as juniors, the 1985 seniors went 10-0 compiling a 3 year record of 26-3. This was the best three year record of any class in Bedford High School History.

Game #1 Bedford traveled to Roaring Spring to play Central in the first game. Bedford's quarterback Bill Creps got Bedford on the scoreboard first on a 19 yard TD run. Central came back to take the lead at the half on an 18 yard run and a 65 yard interception return. The second half was all Bedford with two TDs run by Creps and one by Bryan Borosky. Creps rushed for 140 yards and Borosky 96.

Game #2 Bedford traveled to Somerset. Bill Creps and Bryan Borosky each scored two TDs in the first half as Bedford jumped off to 27-6 lead on the way to their 2nd win of the season 33-6. Borosky 3 TDs and Creps 2 TDs both with 79 yds rushing led the Bisons.
